

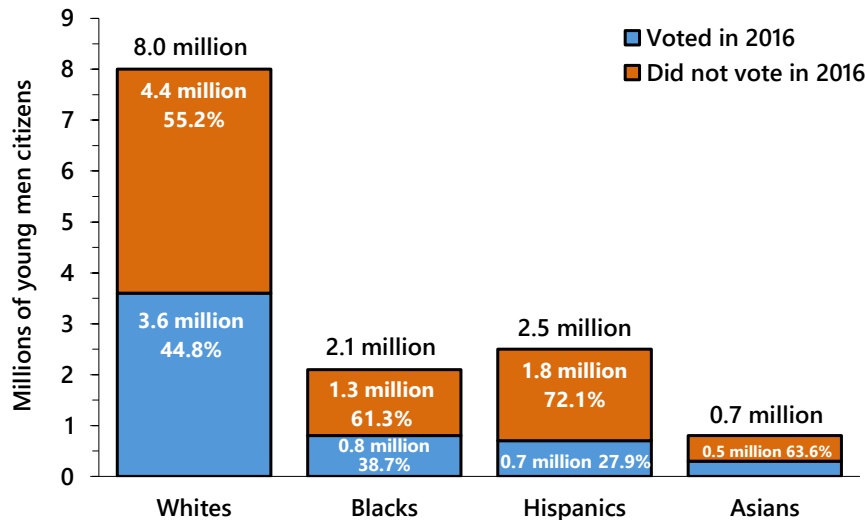
# FACT SHEET: Men by Race and Hispanic Origin

## MISSING VOTERS PROJECT: Young Adults 2016

### Very Low Voting Rates Among Young Men; More Than Half of Missing Voters Were White

Overall, only 40.0% of young men citizens voted in 2016, resulting in 8.1 million missing voters. The lowest voting rates were among young Hispanic men citizens (27.9%), young Asian men citizens (36.4%) and young Black men citizens (38.7%) (Chart A). Fewer than half (44.8%) of young non-Hispanic white men voted in 2016, and the majority (4.4 million, 54.6%) of missing young men voters were white. Over one-fifth (1.8 million) of missing young men voters were Hispanic (Chart B).

#### White Men

Fewer than half (44.8%) of young non-Hispanic white men citizens voted in 2016 (Chart A). There were 4.4 million missing voters, including 3.4 million (75.8%) who were not registered to vote prior to the election (Chart B).

#### Black Men

Only 38.7% of young Black men citizens voted in 2016 (Chart A). This resulted in 1.3 million missing voters. Only 24.9% of these missing voters were registered to vote before the election (Chart B).

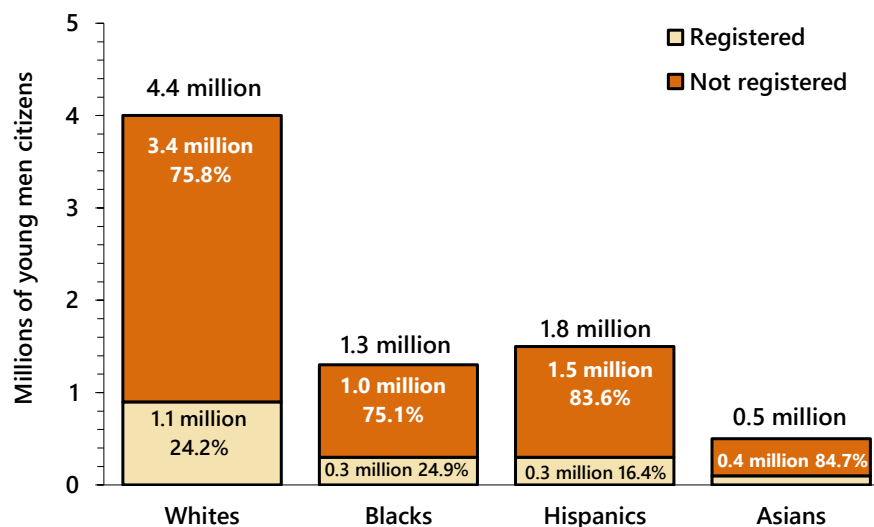
#### Hispanic Men

Only 27.9% of young Hispanic men citizens voted in 2016 (Chart A), resulting in 1.8 million missing voters. The majority of missing voters (1.5 million, 83.6%) were not registered to vote before the election (Chart B).

#### Asian Men

Only 36.4% of young Asian men citizens voted in 2016 (Chart A). There were half a million missing voters, including 0.4 million (84.7%) who were not registered to vote before the election (Chart B).

#### Notes

Please note that some numbers may appear not to add up correctly due to rounding. *Whites* are non-Hispanic, and *Hispanics* may be of any race. *Blacks* and *Asians* include small number of multiracial individuals. Voting data are from the Current Population Survey, (November 2016). Population counts and percentages in these charts are statistically-weighted estimates derived by the Bureau of the Census from a national sample of over 90,000 respondents in 54,000 households.
